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Parents may obtain an evaluation by an independent evaluator at their own expense to support a child's educational needs and programming.

When a parent makes a private evaluator's findings available to the school district, the IEP team **is required** to meet to **consider** the findings of the private evaluation.

The school district **is not required** to accept the outside evaluator's findings by implementing their recommendations in the child's IEP.

Private evaluations paid for by the parent can be introduced as evidence in a due process hearing to determine what is a free appropriate public education (FAPE) for a child.
