Data Summary

What the Data Shows

When comparing data from the 2009-2010 school year to the 2008-2009 school year:

- The number of families (unduplicated) served decreased by 734.
The number of parent/student contacts, school contacts and agency contacts (duplicated counts) all increased.
The number of participants who attended parent mentor-sponsored trainings increased by 2,472.
The number of newsletters/bulk mailings distributed increased by 97,277.
The number of Web site "hits" decreased by 22,689.

Of the 22,458 participants who attended parent mentor-sponsored trainings:

- 7,039 were educators, professionals or agencies, and
15,419 were parents, families or students.

- Responses ranged from 8 to 40 hours per week

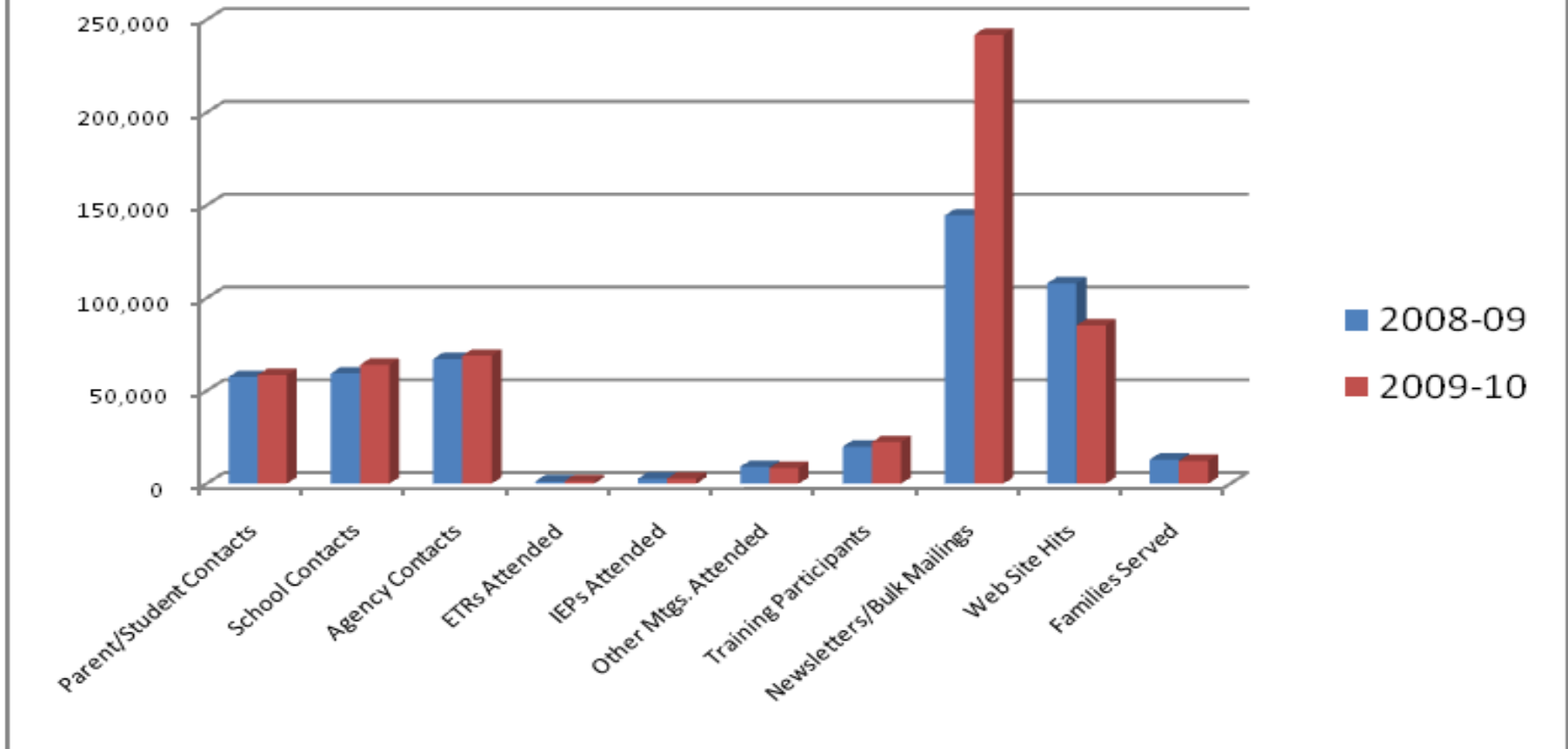
