

Differentiating Language Acquisition from Disability

About the Presenter:



Steven Gill started his career as a school psychologist in a district with a large English Language Learner (ELL) population, where his interest in language learners began. Over the years, he completed graduate work in ELL studies, eventually creating ELL Critical Data Process. Steven has trained over 10,000 educators on the process across more than 300 school districts in multiple states. He and his wife are authors of seven books, primarily focusing on ELL and special education issues. Steve is past president of the Washington State Association of School Psychologists. He is currently working as a school psychologist, writing, training, and consulting.

Series Description:

District teams will use a case study to develop a working knowledge of the ELL Critical Data process. The purpose is to ensure districts are making data-based decisions about special education eligibility for English learners. Mr. Gill will include discussion of language acquisition, literacy skills and Specific Learning Disability identification. Critical thought about special education eligibility consideration for students who are not native English speakers will be addressed.

Series Materials: Each team will receive one copy of <u>The ELL Critical Data Process: Distinguishing between disability</u> and language acquisition. Each attendee will receive a copy of <u>The ELL Special Education Evaluation Workbook</u>.
