

As an Associate Professor at Notre Dame College (NDC), Dr. Andrist began the Reading Endorsement and Master's in Reading programs, including the NDC Reading Clinic and teacher training cohorts in partnership with the Cleveland Municipal School District where she worked as a school psychologist. Through these programs, she insured that all Reading and Intervention Specialists had the opportunity to assess students and design instruction for struggling She is a past president of the International Dyslexia Association (IDA) of Central Ohio and former chair of the Ohio Board of Regents Task Force for Teacher Education in Dyslexia. She is currently a Co-chair of the Ohio IDA Executive Legislative and OSPA Dyslexia Committees Nationally, she serves on the International Dyslexia Association (IDA) program review and exam committees. She is an Internationally Certified Master Trainer for Orton-Gillingham International, Inc. (OGI) and coordinates and conducts OGI trainings in Ohio under the direction of Ron Yoshimoto. Dr. Andrist is dyslexic and is the mother and grandmother of dyslexic children.

<u>Course Description:</u> This 2-day course is designed to help school psychologists understand how to identify students with dyslexia and to help educators provide these students with effective interventions. Dyslexia will be defined within the context of models of reading and reading disabilities including recent neurological information about the reading process. A brief history of the field of learning disabilities will be presented. The definition of dyslexia in current Ohio legislation and its implications for educators and school psychologists will be discussed. An overview of evidence based explicit, systematic Orton-Gillingham based multisensory structured language (MSL) instruction will also be presented.

An overview of the warning signs of dyslexia
Typical profiles of students with dyslexia
Early identification of dyslexia and the role of RTI
